

# August 2020 - Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 124 incidents for the month of August 2020, compared to 116 incidents in August 2019. Firefighters have responded to 845 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 215.52 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 218.74 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 434.26 hours responding to incidents in August 2020.
- Personnel spent 124 hours in training sessions during the month of August 2020. Due to COVID, regular Wednesday night meetings have been held by Zoom.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 5744.84 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
